



## Regents of Univ. of Cal. v. Bakke, 438 U.S. 265, 272 n.1 (1978)

A medical school admitted students based on a system that awarded points for certain attributes including race. The Supreme Court found that the admissions program involved the unlawful use of an explicit racial classification, thereby disregarding individual rights as guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment. The medical school failed to show that the classification was necessary to its goals. Therefore, respondent was entitled to the injunction ordering his admission.

### **The Court Listed Readily Available Scholarship Opportunities, One Being the AMA**

In addition to the Regents' Scholarships and President's Scholarship programs, the medical school participates in the Health Professions Scholarship Program, which makes funds available to students who otherwise might not be able to pursue a medical education. Other scholarships and awards are available to students who meet special eligibility qualifications. Medical students are also eligible to participate in the Federally Insured Student Loan Program and the American Medical Association Education and Research Foundation Loan Program.
