
Dear Representatives Thompson and Upton:

On behalf of the physician and medical student members of the American Medical Association (AMA), I am writing to express our support for H.R. 8, the “Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2021.” This commonsense bill would expand the existing background check system to cover all firearm sales, including those at gun shows, over the internet and through classified ads, while providing reasonable exceptions for law enforcement and family and friend transfers.

As one of the major causes of injury-related deaths, the AMA recognizes that firearm violence is a serious public health crisis in the United States. The AMA has extensive policy on firearm safety and gun violence prevention, including supporting a waiting period and background check for all firearm purchasers. The federal background check system is effective at preventing certain prohibited purchasers, such as convicted felons and domestic abusers, from accessing guns. However, this system could be more effective if unlicensed dealers or private sellers were required to conduct background checks. By closing these loopholes, H.R. 8 can be an important tool in keeping guns out of the hands of those who are prohibited from having them and will help lessen gun violence and save lives.

The AMA applauds your leadership in sponsoring H.R. 8, and looks forward to working with you and your House and Senate colleagues to pass this important legislation.
