Dear Vice Chairman Burke:

On behalf of the American Medical Association (AMA) and our physician and medical student members, I write to thank you for your action to extend Medicaid coverage in Georgia for six months postpartum. High maternal mortality rates are a crisis in Georgia and across the country, and we applaud you for prioritizing maternal health.

With half of all births covered by Medicaid, the program has long served as a vital safety net that helps ensure low-income women have access to the care they need during pregnancy and childbirth. Historically, however, Medicaid coverage terminated shortly after birth. Yet research shows that pregnancy-related deaths occur across a lengthy time span, with about one-third or 33 percent happening one week to one-year postpartum. Tragically, an estimated 60 percent of all maternal deaths are preventable. By extending Medicaid coverage six months after birth, low-income women in Georgia will be better able to access the care they need during the critical postpartum period. This is an important step toward reducing maternal mortality.
